Epi-LASIK takes Laser Vision Correction to the Next Level!

Epi-LASIK is the very latest development in laser vision technology. Using a very precise instrument called the epikeratome, Dr. Vale will gently separate the thin outer layer of the cornea to leave a smooth surface which is then treated using the excimer laser.

For those who are not candidates for LASIK, this procedure offers the fastest and most comfortable recovery. Patients may drive and return to their normal routine one or two days earlier than with the PRK procedure.





The Benefits of Epi-LASIK:

During this procedure the epithelium, a thin surface layer protecting the cornea, is peeled away using the epikeratome, so the laser can then be used to reshape the cornea. There is no incision and the epithelial layer grows back within days following surgery. There is never a chance of dislodging a "flap" created by an incision, as there is with LASIK.

This procedure is ideal for those who lead active lifestyles, such as athletes, or those with hazardous jobs, such as law enforcement officers, fire fighters, foresters and military personnel.

Epi-LASIK is also an option for those with thin or irregularly shaped corneas who cannot have LASIK.

Epi-LASIK is gentle on corneal nerves and less likely to cause or worsen dry eye syndrome.
